School Update	Lisa Osburn has resigned from council. With four voting members remaining quorum will be three voting members. The school has been very busy the last couple of months. We have had many activities throughout the day for students to participate in, such as chess club, intramural volleyball, yoga sessions, badminton, and melty bead key chains. The key chains are made by students and sold to raise money for the earthquake relief fund. This week we have Ramadan presentations in the gym and they include a variety of activities for students to participate in. We are still collecting food items for our Ramadan food drive. Many classes in the school including kindergarten have been focusing on how we are all unique and special, based on the book The Colours of Us. Students have created some colourful pieces of art. Welcome to Kindergarten is coming up on May 25. Grade 8 graduation is scheduled for June 26. September Staffing - we continue to grow. We will be adding another class,

	which means another portable, to the school and likely a second by the time we come back in September. This will likely result in a class or two starting in the gym and library.
	The renovations will start in the summer, possibly before the end of the year. A pad will be created out the back of the school (west yard) to hold 12 portables. The new portables will be added then the remaining four will be moved there as well. There will be ongoing renovations in the fall and the construction for the addition will begin in the spring of 2024.
	The gaga ball pit will be relocated. The drainage issue in the field will be addressed during the construction.

Welcome	Kieran Hoult (librarian), LTO (gr ½), EA supplies,
School Update	Students and staff are engaged in Black History month activities in their classrooms. Activities range from stories, songs, videos and history lessons, depending on the grade level. As a school we are recognizing a special black Canadian every morning on the announcements and classes have the visual slide deck to show students at the same time. February is Kindness month at the Beach. There are schoolwide "random acts of kindness" displayed in the front hall showcase and individual classes are partaking in their own daily acts of kindness. In grade 1, students choose a heart to flip over every

	morning and that is their kindness challenge for the day. Kindergarten classes just celebrated Groundhog Day on February 2 nd . They were outside investigating shadows and looking for groundhog tracks. They are doing lots of outdoor winter exploration and weather tracking. The grade 1 classes will be celebrating the 100 th day of school on February 13 th . Students are officially 100 days smarter and will enjoy a day full of activities about the number 100. Our grade 8 students have recently had the opportunity to choose their courses for high school as they are preparing for their transition next year. Valentine's day is on February 14 th and classes will have their own celebration of friendship and class community. Term 1 report cards are going home on Friday February 17 th , just before the Family Day long weekend.
School Culture	Some examples of Student Behaviour grade 6 to 8 in the last few weeks and is getting progressively worse. - Disrespectful with staff - Yelling at and swearing at staff - Refusing to follow direction - Ignoring teachers - Leaving class without permission and refusing to return - Argue with staff or have a friend argue for them - Closing doors while teachers are on duty - Frequent and long washroom breaks - hiding in the washroom during class and recess/nutrition break - Paper towels all over the washrooms, plugging the toilets - Planned meetings between students - Phones not turned in - Students have phones in the class, in the washrooms and outside at recess Messaging each other and meeting up, going for a walk - Inappropriate use of technology - Issues on the buses - throwing things at the drivers, yelling, switching seats, not sitting, disrespecting the drivers, not following drivers instruction.

	Council members are to maintain a school-wide focus on all issues. Council meetings are not a forum for discussion about individual parents/guardians, students, staff, trustees or other council members.
School Update	Our school is continuing to grow and as a result we had to reorganize the classes on September 27. We gained a kindergarten class, and most classes had to move a few students. We are waiting for a fourth portable to be delivered and set-up. In the meantime, our gr 5/6 class is currently working out of the gym. All classes are doing outdoor gym for the time being. We held our Terry Fox run on Friday September 23 rd . It was a beautiful day
	and students from JK-8 ran around our school yard in support of cancer research. As a school we raised \$640.00. Way to go Sharks!
	Our Meet the Teacher is tomorrow night from 5-6pm, and will be held in person this year. We are expecting a good turnout this year.
	On September 30 th we celebrated Truth and Reconciliation day by wearing orange shirts and participating in a variety of different classroom activities.
	Picture Day is coming up this Friday October 7 th .
	Innisfil Fire is bringing their safety trailer to our school on Wednesday October 12 th for the day. All JK-2 classes will have a chance to tour the trailer and learn about fire safety at home.
	Our cross country participants are currently running at recesses. Students will be selected soon and will compete in the Regional cross country event on October 12 th .
	Our school's Gaga ball pit was installed a few weeks ago, and classes are learning how to play during their outdoor gym classes.
Budget	\$28,309 in our School Generated Funds. Approximately \$13,000 is school nutrition. An updated report will be shared at the November meeting.
Fundraising	Tim Horton Smile Cookies - Innisfil Tim Horton owners, they have told us the campaign went really well this year and we'll be surprised how much we are getting this year. This will continue to support our technology, school yard improvements, athletics (extra-curricular) and general school needs.
	We don't anticipate needing to do any fundraising this year. Our community has had a three year break from fundraising so far.
